NORTH BREVARD CHURCH OF CHRIST TITUSVILLE, FLORIDA OUR FIRST 40 YEARS

The bustle of activity at the Space Center in the early sixties brought brethren into this area from all parts of the country. They found a church home with the brethren in Cocoa. After traveling that distance for some time, the following Titusville brethren, with the blessings of the Cocoa elders, met to discuss establishing a congregation here to accommodate the needs of the Christians in Titusville:

They decided that the new congregation, called the North Brevard Church of Christ, would begin meeting on May 9, 1965. Wilburn H. Rainey delivered the sermon that day. He served as our evangelist while continuing his secular job as coordinator of the evening division at Brevard Junior College in Cocoa. Soon after this new congregation formed, they selected Buck Rhodes and Ray Smith to be their elders.

The new congregation first met in the Titusville Women's Club at the N.E. corner of Broad Street and Hopkins Avenue in downtown Titusville. This property was later remodeled and served as a fire station for several years. The building is still standing, although not in active use. Because other religious groups were using the same facility, it meant some rather unorthodox worship and Bible study hours. Morning worship on the Lord's Day was at 8:15 a.m., Bible Study at 6:00 p.m., followed by evening worship at 7:00 p.m. Ninety-five were in attendance at the first worship service, and sixty-three the following Sunday. Since the facility was used for other purposes we used folding room dividers for our classes, and the communion emblems were carried to and from the building in a wooden case built by one of the members.

Steady growth was to follow that fine beginning. The influx of people to work on the program to put a man on the moon brought many new Christians to the area, many of which settled in Titusville and became involved with the church. Knowing that we needed a more permanent meeting place, we were constantly on the lookout for one. In March of 1967 we were able to rent the old Presbyterian church building at the corner of Pine Street and Hopkins Avenue just three blocks south of where we were then meeting. We held our first service in that large building on March 12. We had problems heating the building, and had to pump water from the lower level whenever we had a downpour. But despite these inconveniences, the building served us well for the next three years. The building has since been torn down.

During this time four and one-half acres of land was purchased at the present location and an architect was employed to design a building for us. After a period of time selling bonds to finance the new facility, construction began in 1969 on the first phase of our facility. This included the classrooms pretty much as they are today, and a large vestibule that served as an auditorium until our financial condition permitted us to build the present auditorium. Our first service was held in the vestibule of the new building on March 15, 1970.

Our dream of a permanent location was realized with the construction of the new building. Brother Rainey continued to serve as our evangelist until it became necessary for him to resign at the end of 1971. Brothers Sam Ayers and Orval Boyd from the Christian Home and Bible School in Mt. Dora came and preached for us each Sunday until we were able to find a full time evangelist. With attendance and contributions steadily increasing, we were soon able to hire Brother Charlie Garner. In July 1973 he and his family moved from Hood River, Oregon to work with us. Knowing that renting was very expensive, we purchased a four bedroom home at 2880 Malibu Court in the Shangri-La subdivision of Titusville to house the new preacher and his family. We had several workdays cleaning and painting the home getting it ready for the Garners' arrival. This has been the home of each of our full-time evangelists and their families, including the Shumate's today.

Following the Apollo Program there were many layoffs at the Kennedy Space Center. We said goodbye to many of our friends and brethren during 1973 and 74, but the Lord always provided what we needed to remain vital and active in His work.

In September 1976 Brother Garner resigned from his position as evangelist, and in November 1976 Brother Charles Wharton, II and his family from Snyder, Texas came to work with us. We continued to grow, and shortly after Brother Wharton's arrival we were able to pay off our outstanding bonds and enter into the second phase of our building program. In the spring of 1978 the new auditorium drawings were complete, the loan secured and a contractor selected to construct the new auditorium. Construction was started in June 1978, and on February 11, 1979 our dedication service was held in the new auditorium. At last, this much needed addition to our facility was completed.

In December 1979 Brother Wharton resigned and our search began for a new man to come and preach for us full time. In July 1980 Brother Jim Mitchell and his wife, Melanie, from Miami, Florida came to work with us. They served with us until midyear 1986.

With our auditorium completed we were able to turn our focus more fully on reaching the lost with the Gospel. It was during Brother Mitchell's tenure that we celebrated the 20th anniversary of the chartering of our congregation. During that celebration on May 5, 1985, we recorded that we were involved in the following avenues of outreach and evangelism.

- Gospel Call, in which we telephoned the people of the community and offer them a free Bible correspondence course. Although this form of contact probably wouldn't be well received today, the program resulted in many lives being touched, and souls being taught and saved.
- World Bible School, in which we sent Bible correspondence courses to people in Nigeria.
- A weekly article in the local newspaper.
- People involved in teaching others through Bible studies conducted in their homes.
- A Zone Program designed to keep informed of the needs of the total congregation, encouraged those who visited our worship services and Bible studies, and promoted Christian fellowship among our members.
- Once each year we hosted the Christian Youth Fellowship in which several hundred young people from Central Florida come together for a period of singing and preaching followed by a meal and a time of fellowship.
- Constantly providing food, clothing and financial aid to needy people in the community and those traveling through our community.
- Providing financial support for orphans' care at the Christian Home and Bible School in Mt. Dora.
- Providing support for the preaching of Jesus to prisoners and their families in the Lake Butler area through the Florida Prison Evangelism ministry, supporting the minister, Gary Wyder.
- Providing support for the Larry Henderson family for the preaching of the Gospel in Thailand.
- Providing financial aid on an emergency basis by special collections, and from the treasury to aid our brethren throughout the world who are hungry.

In August 1986, Terry and Nancy Singleton and their sons Joel and Lee arrived from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, and Terry served as evangelist until January 2000. Many who are present today are here as a direct result of their over thirteen years of diligent work in the Lord's Kingdom.

After an extensive search during which several of the men of the congregation shared preaching responsibilities, Garry and Jo Martin joined us in June of 2000. Garry served as our evangelist until January 2003.

We have fond memories and deep gratitude for each of these men, their wives and families who served us faithfully, “speaking the truth in love,” and leading various works of ministry in the community. Many of our number maintain contact with, pray for and stay involved in the lives of those who have worked with us over the forty years.

Today we are served by Mike and Sue Shumate, who were adopted into our family in June of 2003. They came to Titusville from Pittsburgh, and we are so happy that they chose to come here. We searched long and diligently for them and we feel extremely blessed by them. Immediately, they fit right in among our family here at North Brevard. They are both quite talented and tireless in their work for the Master. Both are warm and caring with big hugs for all and big tender hearts. They are excellent and super-prepared teachers. Mike has valuable experience and talent as a counselor, and Sue has valuable experience and talent working with children. They give 110% effort and we are impressed by them and grateful for them.

MISSIONS

Since 1985, we have continued to develop many of these areas of ministry. In the area of overseas missions, for example, we have supported the Lord’s work in many parts of the world including Haiti, Guyana, Thailand and Zimbabwe. We currently support missionaries working in Zimbabwe and Madagascar. Most recently the Lord has blessed us with the opportunity and ability to provide sponsorship of Nathan and Cheryl Wheeler in Phnom Penh Cambodia since the autumn of 2004. Who would have dared to dream when the war was raging in southeast Asia forty years ago that the Lord would open such doors of opportunity in “the killing fields” of Cambodia. Likewise, we have been able to participate in missions in Russia, the Ukraine and other parts of the former Soviet Union so greatly feared forty years ago.

In education and literature missions we have supported various efforts including sending Bible teachers to Russia, World Bible Translation Center and World Bible School. And within the borders of the United States we have supported several individual congregations including, most recently, the East Orange Church of Christ in Christmas, Florida. We have provided continuous support to Gary Wyder and others in the Florida Prison Missions in Lake Butler, Florida. Support for our mission efforts has not only been financial. Many dedicated members have worked diligently over the years behind the scenes to write letters, grade Bible Correspondence Courses and organize collection drives to meet special needs of our missionaries.

ASSOCIATE MINISTER AND OUR YOUTH MINISTRY

Over the years, dedicated, enthusiastic volunteers have sustained a vibrant youth program. But they, and the eldership and other members of our congregation looked forward to a time when we would be able to add a second full-time worker to our staff. In August of 1997 we were able to fulfill that vision when Joey and Tammy Treat arrived to assist in our evangelism and outreach, with a special emphasis on developing our youth ministry. Following the Treats' departure, Jay and Jenny Collins joined us in May of 2000, staying for about a year. Nathan and Cheryl Wheeler followed, serving from May 2002 until shortly before their departure for their mission to Cambodia in the fall of 2004. In August of 2004, we were blessed with the addition of Matt and Amy Robinson. All these young men and their wives served with tremendous energy and talent. They have provided the leadership necessary to maintain a thriving Sunday School program and Vacation Bible Schools every summer, and participation in Central Florida Bible Camp, Christian Youth Fellowship (CYF) activities, SonQuest and other youth related activities throughout the year. In the year that Matt and Amy have been with us, they have also taken the teens to visit Christian colleges, and on a mission outreach in Parkersburg, West Virginia, as well as numerous local outings.

BENEVOLENCE

We have continued financial support to the Christian Home and Bible School in Mt. Dora. In addition we collect gifts for the children each Christmas and our own Santa and Mrs. Claus deliver them, along with many members of the congregation. Many of our younger couples have developed close, personal relationships with some of the children from Mt. Dora, and we are often blessed to have them study and worship with us, and visit in the homes of our members. We are also involved in providing financial support to the Christian Home in Madagascar through the help of the Barry Rosie Family.

We continue to provide for needy members of our community as needs arise. In the last several years we have stocked a food pantry and provided staples to families every Monday afternoon. At the beginning of each school year we collect and distribute school supplies for children in the community who would not otherwise be equipped to start school. And we provide disaster relief to communities throughout the country and the world when floods, tornadoes, hurricanes, famine, draught or economic crises bring about disaster. A few dedicated members lovingly keep the necessary contacts in the community and throughout the country to see that funds arrive in the right hands at the right time, and the congregation has generously responded many times on a moments' notice with a single appeal.

Charlie Griffin.....
North Brevard Church of Christ Memories

After more than thirty-five years of calling North Brevard my church home, memories of special times, sad times, joyful times and formative times abound. There are memories of people and the way God has changed their lives. There are memories of good times and bad times in the lives of those people, and there are memories of the accomplishments of those people as they attempted to serve God in this place. There are memories of buildings such as the Women's Club Library where we first worshiped together, memories of the beautiful old Presbyterian church building we rented for a time, where Gayle and I were married, as well as memories of the planning, construction and evolution of our current building. Time and space really don't allow me to address all of those memories in the way I might like to; therefore I'm going to discuss just a few of them.

When Gayle and I first became friends, long before we were married, she invited me to church with her, and this included Bible study . The Bible class we attended was for high school as well as early college age students in a small room of the Women's Club Library, which the Church of Christ called home at the time. From the vantage point of a visitor, I observed an interesting set of dynamics in that class. I was extremely impressed with the Bible knowledge of several girls in the class. They loved sharing their knowledge, as well as, apparently feeling a need to be certain that others in the class came to the same level of understanding which they already possessed. Some of the boys, on the other hand, at least seemed to be disinterested, and even reflected a bit of the rebelliousness that was so much a part of the culture of the late 60's and the early 70's in our country. This group was a challenge, but the teacher was equal to the challenge. The teacher of that class was Bob Woods. I will never forget the patience, enthusiasm and love that he portrayed every Sunday to all of those different

personalities in that class. Through that class he became one of the first real examples of Christian manhood in my life. He asked me to lead the first public prayer that I ever led in the context of that class. Bob has continued to serve as an inspiring Godly role model for me, as well as many others.

Another occasion that comes to mind, as I reflect back, happened during a Gospel Meeting conducted by Alan Bryan. Remembering dates is not my gift, but I believe this happened between the late 70's and the early 80's. I had witnessed several baptisms and I had seen a number of people go forward seeking prayers and support or to rededicate their lives at various times. However, the tremendous response to a message delivered by Bro. Bryan still amazes me and stands out in my memory for a couple of reasons. First of all, more than 30 of our approximately 160 attendees answered the invitation that day. Secondly, one of them was my mother, whom I had the honor of baptizing.

The third memory I want to relate actually occurred over an extended period of time. Our son, Chris is in the Marine Corps. and has been deployed to the battlefields in Iraq, not once, but twice. We are deeply humbled by the amount of support we (and he) received during the difficult times that he was very much in harm's way. There was almost never a public prayer offered that did not mention him by name, not to mention countless daily personal petitions on his behalf. In addition to those invaluable prayers, the family of God here sent him many cards, letters and "care packages." It was an unforgettable outpouring of love and support.

These are just a few of my North Brevard Church of Christ memories. There are so many more that I would like to share, but time and space simply do not allow for all of them.

MEMORIES BY GAYLE SMITH GRIFFIN

My own family began here with my marriage to Charles Frank Griffin New Year's Eve 1969. Although I was certain that I wanted to marry Charlie, I was scared to death about assuming all of the responsibilities which we were about to be faced with. The wedding was a big one and involved lots of people, as well as lots of planning. I planned to have "Tootsie," my beloved Fox Terrier, brought in to the church building on a satin pillow, fashioned from the same fabric as the bridesmaids gowns. I had arranged for her to be brought in by my cousin and he was to care for her as she observed the ceremony with the rest of the family. Unbeknown to me, Wilburn Rainey had convinced Charlie & Daddy that a dog in the church building must be a plan which was hatched from the crazed mind of a bride in the throes of extreme premarital stress; therefore, someone should save me from such a scheme of madness. I freely admit that I am still quite mad! You see, I remain convinced that, although it was an unconventional plan, it was a rational and indubitably fitting plan.

Many of you joined us at the ceremony for our son Chris, as he proudly accepted his commission as an officer in the United States Marine Corps. It is one of those memories which are inextricably linked to the church family at North Brevard. The captain who presided over that ceremony pointed out what a rare young man Chris was and how inspiring it was to be associated with someone who had gone through so much to get to that moment of honor. Statistically 1.5 men out of the 2000 who met the difficult requirements to attempt the process, had made it to that point. Captain Merchant was highly impressed by the touching show of love and support from the church family at that ceremony. He said that it was obvious such encouragement had played a big part in the making of such an outstanding young leader. HOW TRULY HE SPOKE! From the actual moment of his birth (Pam Cartwright was there to share the joy) through childhood, adolescence, marriage, two tours of duty in Iraq until the present time he has been wonderfully shaped by the influence, love and prayers of this congregation. June Celsor and Sue Guinn cared for and nurtured him as a little one. Many of you were involved with his activities all through high school. Articles and pictures of Chris from the paper were cut out and proudly displayed by the family here. Some of you helped him get scholarships for college with your letters of recommendation. Jim Bullock and Bob Woods wrote testimonies regarding his character which led to his acceptance in the program to be tested for qualification in the leadership trials for the Marine Corps. When becoming an officer in the USMC, he became convinced that he wanted a picture to inspire him as a military leader. The picture that

he chose was a rare one and difficult to find. Mike Wall joined us in the search and found the print of George Washington kneeling in prayer. Not only the picture itself, but the love that went into getting it for him, will always inspire him.

Both times that Chris was sent into extreme danger in Iraq, the heart of the Church family here at North Brevard went with him. Everyone watched with us for a glimpse of Chris on TV. You sent him countless cards and letters of encouragement and love, plus packages of supplies and goodies for him and his troops. You all prayed, and prayed, and prayed without ceasing. He was touched deeply by that love and support. He often tells people that the outpouring of love from this church family sustained him in his worst times and is so awesome that it defies description.

So.....thank you North Brevard for all the ways that you love and serve and continue to touch my life and make it blessed.

Tell us about what is going on in your lives

We attend church at Kensett, AR., where Doug Robesor preaches. He has been their 27 years and is an excellent Bible teacher. I am not preaching regularly right now. We have been in Arkansas for 28 years at 3 locations. I have preached for one-congregation 3 years and another for 12 years. I have conducted dozens of funerals in this area. I have held Gospel meetings in about half the congregations in White County when I lived there before. One feature of North Brevard that I remember in my six and a half years there is there was not one funeral in the congregation. I know that has changed through the years. We are not physically able to be with you on the 31st, but our prayers are with you.

Special Memories

A group of Christians from the Titusville area were meeting with Cocoa. I had preached one year for Cocoa Beach, but was also attending at Cocoa. David Kirk and Buddy Rowan came to my house and asked me to preach at Titusville. We met in the Women's Club building at 8am and for Bible study and worship in the afternoon. Later we rented the old Presbyterian Church building. We bought some property for the church that was too small so we bought the 4 acres where the church now stands. We sold bonds to build the building, minus the auditorium, which was built later.

Forty wonderful years, and we have been blessed to be a part of this congregation for thirty-nine of those years. We came when worship was held in the Women's Club. We found the warmest Christian family who quickly became our family since all of our blood relatives were in Ohio.

We had four- year- old David, who attended Bible class in the open buildings behind the main building. Nancy Page was the teacher of that 4 and 5 year old class and she continues teaching that age group until this day. We also had one- year- old Jodi, who became accustomed to using our car as the nursery of choice.

We remember taking turns carrying the communion utensils home each Sunday to wash and prepare for the following week. We began a Ladies Bible Class and we met in each other's homes. Love Woods was selected as our teacher and she continued this work until her death. Marion became church treasurer during our first year here. The first family to invite us into their home was Fred and Mary Ann Hall

The space industry was building up and new families came from all over the country to increase attendance so we were delighted to find the old Presbyterian building to rent in 1968. We finally had regular Bible classrooms and a nursery with air conditioning. The men had been searching diligently for land to build our own building and our beautiful property on Park Avenue was purchased in 1968. One memory, Hurricane Camille devastated Mobile and we collected clothing and supplies and we all worked diligently to sort, box and ship to churches there.

It was decided to build on our lot in phases since we were small and lacked funds to build a complete building. In 1970, the first phase was completed which consisted of the current foyer and the classroom section. We sat on folding chairs in that foyer and there was a tank behind the pulpit, where the back door is now, for baptisms.

David was baptized in that tank by his father. He and Bryan Hall were learning to lead singing and they both loved to lead "Master the Tempest is Raging" so the congregation quickly learned where to turn in the song book when either of those little boys got up to lead. Mark was born the first fall we worshipped in the foyer.

While worshipping in the foyer, we hired our first full time minister and this is when the Charlie Garner family came to bless us with their energetic, outgoing personalities and also Jenet's parents, the Springer's, came to bless our lives.

After a few years, it was decided to build the auditorium section with a lot of the work being done by the membership to cut costs. We started worshipping in here in 1979. One of the funniest memories now, but the most embarrassing then was, that while their fathers were working on the auditorium, Mark and Chris Griffin took Elmer's glue and squirted it all over the tables and chairs in their 4 and 5 year classroom. This incident only proves that mischievous little boys can grow up to be wonderfully responsible, Christian men.

Sponsoring a missionary has always been a dream of ours, so we are very happy our congregation is finally able to be the oversight congregation for Nathan and Cheryl Wheeler in Cambodia.

We are happy Mike and Sue Shumate and Matt and Amy Robinson are presently working as ministers here. We are happy to have so many young families bringing up their children in the Lord. We are happy to see our younger men preparing to serve this congregation as elders and deacons.

Our prayer for this congregation is that we may continue to grow in number and in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ and one day be presented as a glorious church to our Lord.
