## From Consumer to Disciple

The early church in Acts was unstoppable. Despite persecution, poverty, and countless obstacles, they continued to grow. What made them so resilient? They lived as disciples, not consumers.

Our culture trains us to think like consumers in every area of life. Unfortunately, we bring this mindset into the church. Consumer Christianity asks, "How does this benefit me? What am I getting out of this?" It treats worship services and ministries as products rather than training grounds for service.

Discipleship asks a different question: "How is God training me to serve others?" The church doesn't exist to minister to you—it exists to equip you to minister to others.

Acts 2:44-47 reveals something remarkable about the first Christians. They "had all things in common," selling possessions and sharing with anyone in need. This generosity wasn't forced. Their choice flowed from what they believed about Jesus—that He truly reigns as King. Luke describes their hearts as "glad" and "generous." They were all in, willing to share anything because they had already offered themselves completely to God.

Here's the key difference: consumers give in order to receive something in return. Disciples give because they have already received everything—salvation, acceptance, love, and forgiveness. They don't give to get; they give because grace has already been given to them. Acts 4:32 contains a powerful statement: "No one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own." It's easy to say theoretically that everything belongs to God. But the early church went further—they said everything belonged to their brothers and sisters in Christ. That's much harder because your brother might actually need to borrow your car or ask for help with bills.

The result? "There was not a needy person among them" (Acts 4:34). When someone prayed for help, God's answer often came through the open hands of fellow believers.

Nothing reveals our theology like our generosity. Our giving patterns show what we truly believe about the empty tomb, the reign of Jesus, and whether we're truly family in Christ.

This week, examine your heart honestly. Are you approaching church as a consumer or as a disciple? What resources has God placed in your hands that could meet someone else's needs? The early church was unstoppable because following Jesus meant complete surrender—not just of their hearts, but of their resources and comfort. When we make this shift, we become unstoppable too.
