The Certainty of God's Victory

In a world filled with anxiety and uncertainty, many Christians find themselves living as if evil might actually win. We've accepted the premise that we're the heroes in a story where the odds are stacked against us. But this perspective misses the central message of Revelation: God's victory is not just probable—it's inevitable.

Too often, cultural voices convince us to live with high levels of anxiety, believing there's a real chance that evil will triumph. These voices come from television, social media, and sometimes even from pulpits. This is exactly why the book of Revelation is so crucial for believers today. It teaches us to recognize that this propaganda is a lie. Revelation isn't primarily about chronology—when this or that will happen. Instead, it's about the absolute certainty of God's triumph over evil.

Throughout Revelation, we see repeated assurances of God's ultimate victory. Revelation 11:15 declares: "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he shall reign forever and ever." This isn't wishful thinking—it's the guaranteed end of the story. God was always going to win. The Lamb was always going to be victorious.

As Christians, we live between celebration and anticipation. We celebrate what Jesus has already accomplished through His death and resurrection, while we anticipate His second coming. This means we can say "Hallelujah" even when enemy forces seem to be attacking. We don't ignore evil or pretend brokenness doesn't exist, but we live with confidence from knowing how the story ends.

Revelation 19 presents a beautiful picture of the marriage supper of the Lamb—a great feast where heaven and earth are fully reconciled. Every Sunday when we take communion, we're anticipating this supper. God is saving the very best for last, and this supper is absolutely going to happen.

When Revelation describes the final confrontation between good and evil, there's no extended battle scene. The beast and false prophet are simply captured and thrown into the lake of fire. This isn't an oversight—it's the point. There's no tension because there's no real contest. God's victory is so certain that we're not even supposed to contemplate the possibility of His defeat.

The certainty of the Lamb's victory should fundamentally change how we live. We don't need to live in anxiety or fear about whether good will triumph over evil—it will. The only question that remains is our loyalty. This week, examine your life honestly: Are you demonstrating loyalty to Jesus through your actions, or just your words?

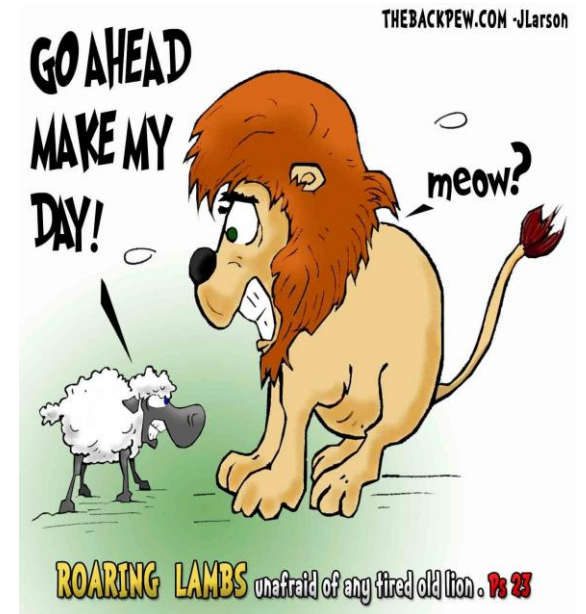
