- A. 3000+ souls were being directed by (the Lord's) one heart and soul.
- B. In contrast to individualism, Jerusalem saints viewed Jesus as the Savior of the body. (**Eph. 5:23**).
- C. Church membership is NOT like being a member of a club.
- D. Biblical body-membership changes everything! (**Rom.12:4-5, I Cor.12:12-13**)
- E. Christians actively yield to the mind/will of Christ, who is Head of His body.

- A. Consider their care & compassion for one another. (**Acts 4:32; 5:4**)
- B. Personal sacrifice was made to benefit (all members within) the body.

IV. Their B Were O By Unity In Christ.

A. The Jerusalem congregation began with people of numerous backgrounds and even combative cultural views. (**Acts 2:9-11; 6:1-6**) Walls of worldly hostilities are torn down as one becomes a member of Christ's Body!

B. Unity in Christ overshadows diversity in backgrounds. (Consider Barnabas).

C. **Col. 3:11**. In the church of **one heart and soul**, we don't see anything that would divide those thinking like the lost world.

D. If Jesus could bring together Matthew, a tax collector, and Simon, a Zealot, He can bring together anyone in Rome, GA. who comes to Christ.

V. Their unity T to the doctrine of the risen Jesus.

A. Consider the context of **Acts 4:33**.

B. Their *testimony* was part of this *unity*. Their *unity* supported their *testimony*.

C. The “*one heart and soul*” must be emphasized, embraced and enacted for it all to work. (**John 17:20-21**)

D. The issue of “*one heart and soul*” is about testifying Christ to the world. Unity matters because Christ matters.
